

The USA Swimming Foundation is pleased to announce its 2014 Make a Splash grant recipients. In March of 2014, the USA Swimming Foundation awarded 57 grants, totaling 329,995 to Make a Splash Local Partners in 24 states across the country! With the 2014 grants provided this year, the USA Swimming Foundation is proud to have awarded more than \$3.3 million in grant funding since 2007.

Over the summer, the USA Swimming Foundation awarded 2 grants during its Make a Splash Tour, presented by Phillips 66 and then 6 additional grants in the fall. With the inclusion of the 8 additional grants, the USA Swimming Foundation awarded 65 grants in 24 states totaling \$346,615. This grant funding is projected to serve 12,247 children across the country.
